SADLY REMEMBERING THREE INDONESIAN BROTHERS

The Indonesian fellow-brothers, the congregation, and the general executive have had to deal, in a short period of time, with the passing of three fellow-brothers.

MEMBER OF THE EXECUTIVE, BROTHER NICO SIMANJUNTAK'S SUDDEN PASSING

Wholly unexpected, brother Nico passed away on August 14, 2021. Nico joined the congregation in 1977. He studied nursing at the university, and for many years he had a leadership role at the outpatient clinic at Desa Putera. Brother Nico got to be known as a good organizer, and as a friendly person in dealing with personnel and patients.



In the following years, he got other leadership functions, such as treasurer, secretary, and chairman of the Budi Mulia foundation. In 1998 he became a member of the general executive of the congregation, and moved to Oostakker. In 2001, he was elected for the function of provincial superior for Indonesia, and he served in that function until 2010. In that year, he was chosen as substitute for the general superior, and once again moved to Oostakker. Starting in 2013, he served as a member of the general executive living in Indonesia, combining this with being the director of the orphanage in Gentang (Solo, Java). In 2016, he was re-elected once again as a member of the general executive. He moved to Sumatra to become the director of the boarding school in Pangururan (Lake Toba). While taking part in sports with students, he became unwell, and passed away in the hospital.

Brother Nico, in addition to the Indonesian language, also spoke Dutch and English. In this way, he made many friends in Belgium and The Netherlands, and this helped him in creating an extensive network of people, among

them many expats who generously supported our social projects in Indonesia. He will continue to live on in memory as a good friend. He is buried in the cemetery of the brothers in Pematangsiantar.

TWO PIONEERS

With the death of Br. Hubertus Nadapdap, the congregation and the Indonesian province lost one of her prominent figures. Trained as a teacher, he moved to Brazil to reinforce the community of brothers there, among others as master of novices and member of the executive. His spontaneity, his sense of humor, also his care for the poor, were typical for him. After his return to Indonesia, this kind brother remained active especially in education and as a superior. During his final years, br. Hubertus, as a result of his sickness, became more and more restricted in his freedom of movement. He passed away on August 27, 2021.

We also had to say goodbye to brother Laurentius Sukartono. He was the second native provincial superior. He studied religion and catechesis. In addition to teaching, he was also involved for many years in

education and formation of candidate brothers. During his last years, his health left much to be desired, but he remained a person of service, a humble brother, who strongly held on to prayer and contemplation. He passed away on September 27, 2021.

THE NETHERLANDS

THE PROCESS OF CHANGE FOR THE COMMUNITY OF BROTHERS

The Dutch provincial chapter of 2019 decided to change from province to district (analogous to the Belgian province that already in 2016 took the step in that direction), giving the executive of the Dutch province the authority to request this change from the general executive. The provincial executive has started this process, and the advice to set up a committee to facilitate this change-over was followed up by the provincial executive. In this process, the brothers of the Dutch province were intimately involved; also an appeal was made for the input from the KNR (Conference of Dutch Religious). After this process was completed, the general executive was informed of the request mentioned above, and also approved it as such. On December 8, 2021, the province will become a district, and the Dutch brothers will add a new chapter to their rich history of being a Dutch province for 111 years.
